Great News! The Council is negotiating with Hillstown Miners Welfare Trustees to build a children's playground on the Hillstown Recreation Ground.

Scarcliffe Parish Council Chair, John Young says: "Talks have been very fruitful, and we are now waiting for solicitors to draw up a lease agreement. Hillstown is the only community of its size in the Bolsover District Council area without a playground for 4-12-year-olds and we are delighted to be working with the Welfare Trustees to provide one." The new playground will include at least six new pieces of equipment and be surrounded by a safety fence.

Orders have been placed to provide a dog-proof safety fence around the children's play area at Palterton. Work should commence in the next few weeks.

We are also adding a swing suitable for disabled children to our existing play equipment. New benches have been added around the sides of the football field.



Speed InformationDevices

Traffic in the Parish has grown very rapidly in recent years and many residents are concerned that a high number of drivers are exceeding the speed limits. The Council has applied to Derbyshire County Council for permission to erect Speed Information Devices around the Parish that will warn drivers if they are travelling too fast.



We have worked with the local police to identify the places where SIDs are most needed. We aim to buy two or three devices which will be rotated around our villages every two months. The SIDs will be solar powered and can give us information about the number of vehicles that fail to observe the speed limits.





Hillstown Disabled Ramp


The council donated £2,500 towards the installation of an emergency ramp at Hillstown Village Hall's new Garden Room which completes the site for wheelchair access.



The Hillstown Allotments site on Langwith Road was first leased by Scarcliffe Parish Council on behalf of the Hillstown Allotments Association in 1896. We have been in partnership for 130 years. The land was rented from a local farmer, then Lord Bathurst and finally the Chatsworth Estate. The Council bought the land outright in 1958.

Allotments became less popular as local pits closed and by 2022 there were only 20 tenants where there had previously been scores. The HAA reconstituted in 2022 and today 65 people are enjoying their allotments.

This success is due to the hard work of members under Chairman Cllr Justin Rigg. The Council is currently looking to find funds to make the site less muddy in the wet weather and provide a composting toilet. In our next magazine we will feature our Palterton allotments.



The Parish Council is continuing its long tradition of promoting Xmas activities. This year's Pantomime is Aladdin and will be taking place at Palterton Village Hall on November 25th. Tickets can be ordered using the leaflets enclosed with this magazine.

Xmas Grants have been made to Palterton Residents Association and Scarcliffe Activities Committee to be spent on Christmas events. Hillstown over 60's will be offered a Christmas box of festive confectionery.

The Palterton Welfare Trustees have received a generous grant from The Duke of Devonshire's Charitable Trust to provide small selection boxes, snacks and drinks to children attending the Pantomime.

The grant will also pay for Xmas lights and other decorations at the Hall. Over the cold weather period we will be running free cafe sessions in the Village Hall. People can enjoy a chat and free tea and biscuits in a warm room.





The latest addition to our range of activities at Palterton is the Little Cubs Sensory Hub. Launched by Ellie when her son was just 8 weeks old, the Hub is a place where babies are encouraged to develop at their own pace in a relaxed environment that respects each child's individual growth journey. Sessions offer not only valuable developmental opportunities for babies, but also space for parents and carers to connect, share advice, and support one another through challenges of early parenthood.
